EVERGREEN PARK LIBRARY'S LOCAL HISTORY COLLECTION

Recently, EP Library received a grant from the Illinois State Historical Records Board to organize, preserve, and digitize the local history collection. The library is currently in the final stages of organizing and digitizing its local history collection. The physical collection is now available to all researchers at the library. Using digitization software, selected items will be accessible via the library's website in late November. Once completed with this project, the library looks to partner with the Evergreen Park Historical Commission to provide digital access to the Historical Commission's extensive collection and inspire a reawakening in Evergreen Park history and pride. 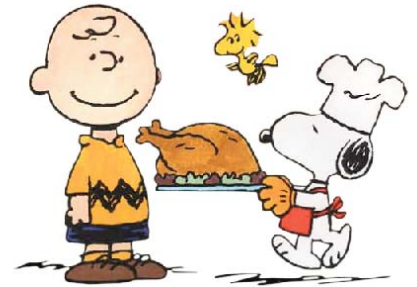

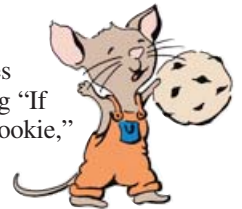

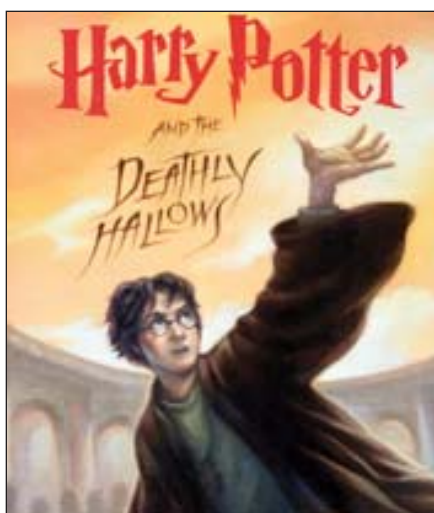

Bridging the Digital Divide

Evergreen Park Public Library received a “Bridging the Digital Divide” grant through the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity. Twelve public computers in the Adult Services department have been replaced with new models. New equipment was installed so that the library now provides fast broadband Internet access (50 mbps download and 5 mbps upload speeds) throughout the building. Twelve notebook computers were purchased to provide hands-on instruction in Basic Computers (in English and Spanish) and Microsoft Office.

A laptop can be checked out for 1 hour or longer, if no one is waiting to use it for a total of 3 hours per day. The fee is \$1/hour, waived for EP residents with a valid EP Library card and a driver's license or state ID.
