We're honoring humorist, philosopher, and social satirist Samuel Langhorne Clemens, aka Mark Twain during Twaintasia. He was America's first literary celebrity and considered in his time to be the funniest man on earth.

Thomas Hart Benton Travel Exhibit Jan 10 through Jan 21

Like fellow Missourian Twain, Benton created his images with a raw, unvarnished tone, intending to present the straightforward and unpretentious character of mainstream America. He created the lively illustrations that accompany limited-edition publications of Mark Twain's *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*, *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, and *Life on the Mississippi*. Copies of the artist's most famous works will be on display in the library.

☎ **Paranormalist, Mind Reader and Illusionist Scott Xavier!** Tuesday, Jan 25, 7:00 pm

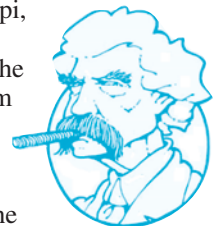
Spiritualism developed and reached its peak membership from the 1840s to the 1920s. By 1897 there were more than 8 million followers in the U.S. and Europe!
