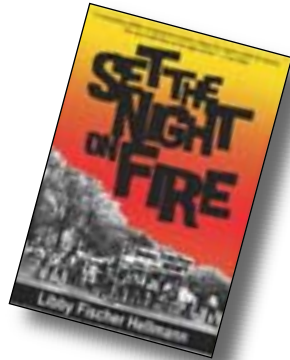

Visit www.mediaondemand.org and download free Kindle ebooks through the Evergreen Park Public Library! All you need is a valid EP Library card and an Internet connection. Here's how:

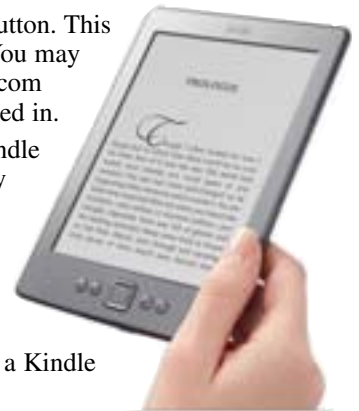
1. Browse and check out a Kindle book from www.mediaondemand.org.

2. Click the "Get for Kindle" button. This opens the Amazon.com web site. You may need to sign in with your Amazon.com account if you are not already logged in.

3. Select a Kindle device or Kindle reading app. Click the "Get Library book" button and sync your device or app to download the book, or choose to send it to your device via USB.

4. You need an active Wi-Fi connection for wireless delivery to a Kindle device. If your Kindle is not Wi-Fi capable or you don't have a Wi-Fi connection, follow Amazon's instructions for transferring files via USB. The books are not delivered via Kindle's 3G connection.

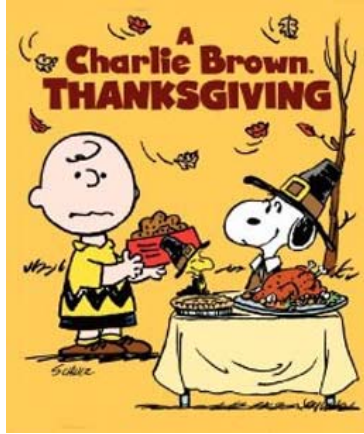

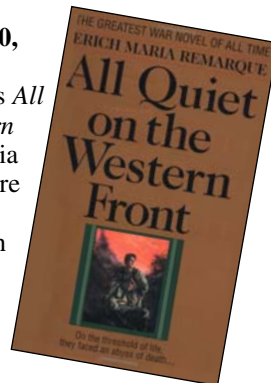

BRIDGING THE DIGITAL DIVIDE

Evergreen Park Public Library received a second "Bridging the Digital Divide" grant through the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity. The library's server and six computers in the Youth Services department have been upgraded with new models. 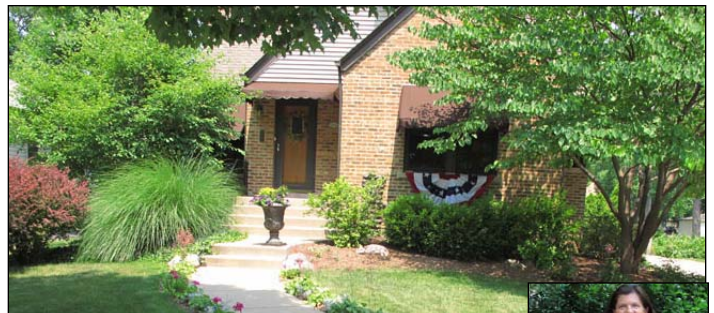
