Fine Amnesty Jan 8 through Jan 14

If you live in Evergreen Park, you are entitled to a free library card. Bring a current government-issued photo ID as proof of residency. A parent or legal guardian must present proof of residency and sign the application of a child under age 18. Lost your card? Show your ID, pay \$2, and get a new one!

Clear your conscience and help the needy in our community! Pay your fines the week of January 8 through Saturday, January 14, and EP Library will waive ½ of the total amount owed. The amnesty applies to fines and fees for lost or damaged items owned by EP Library. It does not include fees for lost or damaged items borrowed from other libraries, collection agency fees, or payments made online. Amnesty proceeds will be donated to the **Evergreen Park Village Pantry**, which assists individuals or families experiencing hard times.

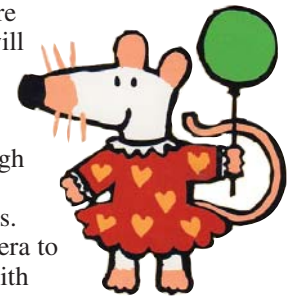
