Evergreen Park Public Library celebrates Kurt Vonnegut



Kurt Vonnegut was one of the most influential, controversial, and popular novelists of the 20th century. Millions know him as a counter-culture guru, anti-war activist, and satirist of American life. His books, including *Cat's Cradle*, *Slaughterhouse-Five*, and *Breakfast of Champions* blend satire, dark humor, and science fiction. Join us in January as we examine the author and his work.

Kurt Vonnegut served in the US Infantry in Europe during WWII and was taken prisoner during the Battle of the Bulge, for which he was later awarded the Purple Heart. Vonnegut was known for his humanist beliefs, and was a lifelong supporter of the American Civil Liberties Union. Visit the world-class special exhibitions at the Illinois Holocaust Museum in Skokie, which explore broad themes that promote human rights and the elimination of genocide.



And So It Goes: Kurt Vonnegut, A Life is the first and only complete life-story of Kurt Vonnegut. Think of Kurt Vonnegut and you imagine a lanky man, icon of the counter-culture movement with a nimbus of curly chestnut hair surrounding his face, underscored by a heavy, boomerang-shaped mustache. Would this also fit in your mind with the upper-middle class son of conservative Republican parents who were isolationists at the start of World War II? Or someone who invested in Dow chemical stock during the Vietnam War, owned a white Mercedes, and lived in the Hamptons?

Few outside his family and friends knew the arc of his extraordinary life. He made friends easily, but always felt lonely; he sold millions of books, but never felt appreciated; he described himself as a humanist, but fought with humanity at large. As a former public relations man, he crafted his image carefully—the avuncular, curly-haired humorist—though admitting, “I myself am a work of fiction.” Biographer Charles J Shields spent five years researching and writing this definitive work (a *New York Times* and *Washington Post* Notable Book of 2012) that reveals the man who enchanted a generation.





Picasso and Chicago at the Art Institute

In 1913 the Art Institute of Chicago became the first art museum in the country to present the work of a young Pablo Picasso. *Picasso and Chicago* is the first large-scale Picasso display organized by the museum in almost 30 years, and celebrates the 100 year relationship with an exhibit of over 250 of the artist's paintings, sculptures, prints, drawings, and ceramics from the Art Institute and private collections.

\$25 cost includes school bus transportation, audio tour, general admission to the Art Institute, and entry to the Picasso exhibit. Lunch is on your own. A minimum of 20 registrants by March 18 is needed to schedule the trip.
