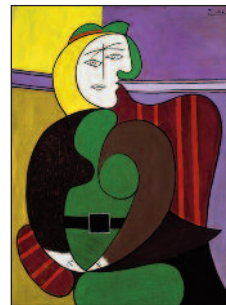
What was life really like for the servants who worked below stairs in the era of *Downton Abbey*? Who were the people who toiled around the clock to ensure the smooth running of these glamorous households? In this new first-person program, British domestic servant Margaret Powell (as portrayed by Leslie Goddard) introduces life below stairs in stately English homes in the early 1920s. Based on Powell's best-selling memoir *Below Stairs*, this program gives a lively look at the work it took to run a wealthy household in this era and the eccentricities often found among employers. Powell's 1968 book was among the inspirations for the popular television series *Downton Abbey* and directly inspired the 1970s series *Upstairs, Downstairs*.

In 1913 the Art Institute of Chicago became the first art museum in the country to present the work of a young Pablo Picasso. *Picasso and Chicago* is the first large-scale Picasso display organized by the museum in almost 30 years, and celebrates the 100 year relationship with an exhibit of over 250 of the artist's paintings, sculptures, prints, drawings, and ceramics from the Art Institute and private collections.

The \$25 cost includes school bus transportation, audio tour, general admission to the Art Institute, and entry to the Picasso exhibit. Lunch is on your own. A minimum of 20 registrants by March 18 is needed to schedule the trip.

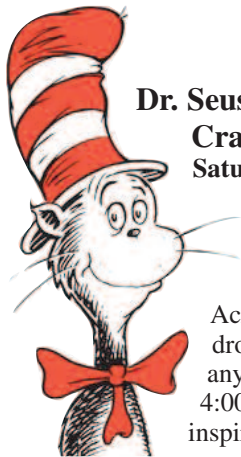

## Butterfly Garden and Monarch Waystation

The beautiful garden at the Evergreen Park Public Library was created in 2010 with the purpose of attracting monarch butterflies. It features three varieties of milkweed, about 75 plants in total, which is the only plant on which monarch butterflies will lay their eggs. Their favorite is the tropical milkweed, an annual with red and either yellow or gold flowers. Both flower from June to October, and when planted in a garden you can observe monarch eggs, caterpillars, and butterflies close up.

Over the past three years Bob has collected hundreds of monarch eggs in the library garden, a space that was previously unused. Caterpillars that are left to survive on their own have almost no chance of becoming butterflies. He has released thousands from his garage, and is an evangelist for others to take up his cause. Bob lectures to garden clubs about attracting and raising monarch butterflies, and teachers, moms, and grandmothers have all eagerly participated.
