

Endangered Bumblebee in Butterfly Garden

Evergreen Park resident and butterfly garden curator Bob Erlich reported that a study by Governors State University's



Department of Environmental Biology placed the library's garden second out of twenty gardens in attracting and helping the bee population. In fact, it is believed that the first bee species to be added to the federal endangered species list —the rusty patched bumblebee— was sighted in our garden. This is called the "Holy Grail" of bee discoveries.
